**Narrative:**

**Case Background**

Logan FARRAR voted two times in the November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020 general elections by completing an "Official Absentee Ballot Application/Certification" on 10-28-2020 in Wisconsin. Logan FARRAR is on the permanent early voting list (PEVL), in Arizona, and a ballot was automatically loaded into his record on 09-28-2020, sent on 10-07-2020 and received back completed on 10-31-2020. The ballot number is 037G02, the ballot ID is B-39933796 from batch ID 11098.

All of the case numbers taken with this investigation are as follows: 2022-22045, 22046, 22048, 22050, 22051, 22053, 22055, 22056, 22057, 22058, 27859, 27860, 27861, 27862, 27863, 27864, 49812.

**Investigation**

On 06-14-2022 I reviewed the documents provided to me by the Yuma County Recorder's Office. Among the documents are copies of voter registrations with the alleged signature of Logan FARRAR. Additionally the ballot affidavit from Wisconsin, also allegedly signed by Logan FARRAR, is attached. All of the signatures appear to match however a scientific examination will need to be conducted to confirm that.

I found that Logan FARRAR allegedly dropped off an early ballot in person at the Yuma County Recorder's Office on or about 10-07-2020, per the Recorder's Office, and voted an absentee ballot on 10-28-2020 in Wisconsin. I have been provided a copy of the Wisconsin affidavit however I do not yet have the ballot envelope from Yuma County to compare it to.

Currently the Arizona ballot envelopes, from the 2020 general elections, are locked in the vault at the Yuma County Treasurer's Office and a court order is required to access them for signature comparisons.

On 06-21-2022 a search warrant was drafted for the ballot envelope at the Yuma County Treasurers Office and signed by Judge Mark Wayne REEVES. On 06-22-2022 the search warrant was served and the ballot envelope was obtained. Copies of the signatures provided by the Yuma County Recorder's Office were sent with the ballot envelopes to the Arizona Department of Public Safety Crime Laboratory for analysis and comparison. I am currently awaiting the results. On 06-23-2022 the search warrant was returned to Judge Kathryn STOCKING-TATE.

**Narrative:**

On 06-29-2022, at approximately 1110 hours, I contacted Mr. Logan FARRAR via the phone number I had listed for him of [REDACTED]. Mr. FARRAR answered and I identified myself. I explained I was conducting an investigation into some ballot issues with the 2020 general election and asked him if he had a moment to speak with me. He stated that he did.

The following is a general summary of the telephone conversation.

I again explained that I was investigating some issues with the ballots during the 2020 general election and confirmed that he has moved around quite a bit, that he used to live in Yuma and then Wisconsin for a while. He stated he was born and raised in Yuma, was staying in Wisconsin and now he is in Mesa, Arizona. He stated that he typically uses his parents address for mail.

I asked him if he voted in the general election in 2020 and he stated that he was not sure. He stated that he tried to vote but he did not know if anything was tabulated or not. I asked if he knew where he tried to vote and he stated that he "tried to do it in Wisconsin but they would not let it and then he voted in Arizona or vice/versa".

I told him that he was on the permanent early voting list in Arizona so he would have gotten a ballot somewhere. He stated that was the question, "somewhere". He stated that his recollection is he tried to do "the thing" but he did not do it in time and Wisconsin had a thing where he could submit one but it was only counted if it was close?. I am not sure what he was trying to get to with that. He stated that Wisconsin is really weird.

I told him that the information that I had is that he is on the permanent early voting list in Arizona. They sent a ballot out on October 7<sup>th</sup> and it was returned completed on October 31<sup>st</sup>. I explained that I also had a copy of an absentee ballot from October 28<sup>th</sup> of 2020 from Genoa City. He stated that he is not sure what that means and the dates were throwing him off. I explained that it was just a few days before the election.

He stated that during that election time he was in Wisconsin because he waited in line. He stated unless they have a window where you can vote early and it was years ago. He stated that he knows he tried to vote there because he was not sure if he voted in Yuma or he had not turned it in yet. He asked if I was saying he voted twice then? I told him that was the allegation. I then explained how the double votes are tracked and investigated.

He asked if it was a criminal thing and I told him that it could be. I told him that I had all of the signatures from previous registrations in both states and ballot envelopes and that they were sent for signature analysis. I told him that if he did not do it then it won't be the same signature. He stated that he wanted to vote and from his stand point he wanted to get his one vote. He stated that he lives in a house in Mesa and now has one address so this doesn't happen again.

I asked him if he had any questions for me and he stated that he did not.

I am currently awaiting the signature analysis from the Arizona Department of Public Safety Crime Lab.

Examination and comparison of questioned item #A1 with known item #1 resulted in the following opinion:

- There are indications that the questioned signature on item #A1 may have been executed by the writer of item #1, Logan FARRAR. The simplistic nature of the questioned and known signatures prevents a more definitive conclusion.

This case is being forwarded to the Yuma County Attorney's Office for review of charges.
