Disclaimer

Disclaimer regarding illegal ballots versus illegal voters: While this report identifies many illegally cast ballots and the names of ineligible voters in whose name those ballots were cast, it does not allege that those persons necessarily cast the illegal ballots. Determining who cast a ballot, legal or otherwise, particularly as a private, non-governmental organization, proves nearly an impossible feat.

Disclaimer regarding redaction of voter information and research: The public version of this report has redacted appendixes that include voter data and supplemental research. The full version, available to government and law enforcement officials and, on a limited basis, to select individuals and members of the media, has no such redactions.

Summary

Over one year ago, Look Ahead America published a report in which we confirmed likely illegal and questionable registrations at P.O. Boxes, National Change of Address (NCOA) locations, and Out of State Subsequent Registrations (OOSSR): <https://lookaheadamerica.org/GeorgiaReport/>.

Secretary of State (SOS) Brad Raffensperger later validated our method for detecting fraud and illegal registrations using the NCOA: <https://lookaheadamerica.org/gasosncoa/>.

Recently, we determined that the county clerks' offices failed to do due diligence regarding P.O. Box registrations as they assumed that the SOS verified using the proof of residency provided by the Department of Driver Services' (DDS) approving these addresses for use as valid locations for driver's licenses. Voters hid their P.O. Box locations under listings as "apartments", "units", and "suites" or businesses posing as residences. They may have committed other types of fraud using Georgia issued identifications. Since then, many investigators from District Attorneys, to the SOS Investigations department, to the DDS' Investigations department have contacted us and been in touch regarding a number of cases opened that we have published.

As to these three issues, the following pages include our correspondence with the affected county clerks. Unfortunately, many counties have failed to respond to our inquiries, though we did send all OOSSR and PO Box cases to higher investigative departments for review.

To address this one first, I thought that we had taken care of anyone registered at a PO Box within our jurisdiction and will be addressing this issue at my board's next meeting to ensure that anyone who is registered at a PO Box provides us their valid residential address prior to voting in the next election. I appreciate you bringing this issue to my attention.

As far as your other email goes, my office does not have an investigator but I am curious about the two voters you sent. Besides being on the NCOA list, what specific evidence do you have of the date that those individuals established residency in other states and do you have any specific evidence that they voted in those states in the 2020 General Election? Frankly my first thought is that these should probably be sent to the State Election Board who does have the authority and more importantly resources to properly investigate your concerns.

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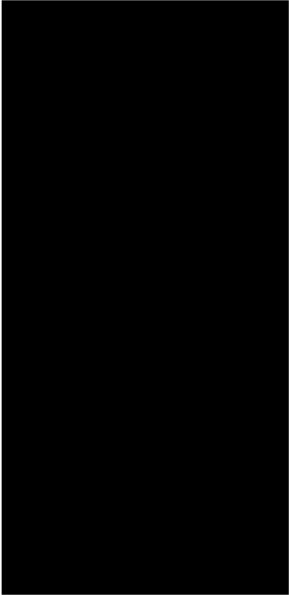





Thank you for this information, however, while I see both an Avenue E and Avenue W (of which the 250 area would be at a recycling plant), and there is a Georgia Avenue, according to the property records for Fayette and Google Maps and 3rd party tools there is no 250 Georgia Avenue (or even anything in the 100-200 range).

Looking through that street there are zero apartments let alone multiplexes either (she is at [REDACTED] purportedly).

You can even find a review from her saying she has a box there:

Walk in the door of this post office, temperature "HOT", I put a door stopper at the door to keep it open and hoping the room will cool off. The wait was 20 minutes to a representative. After the Rep took care of my business, **I got a notice to sign for a certified piece of mail out my box.** I go back to the same Rep who tells me I need to get back in line. Then I ask for the supervisor or manager, she tells me they don't be around here all the time. She get my letter after another customer in line comes with his notice of a certified piece of mail. They get no stars from me.

Thank you for the quick reply. I see that 3 have since moved out, and that 5 are placed in pending to update their address, but 1 says Address is Good despite the PO Box?

I'm confused on that one how it is considered good, unless you meant she has a residential now but the note is wrong / not reflecting the new address?

I'm also really curious how this was missed and nothing happened since 2020 as these voters have been voting since 2020 and we had submitted these to the GA SOS back then for review, but were ignored as being "baseless" claims. Do you know what method they used to register? I am assuming through the DDS unless the clerks missed this.

It would seem to be illegal by all measures, especially since they have voted there in addition to having registered:

Can you confirm that to be the case here?



I have placed each of these voters in Challenged Status and will be mailing them letters letting them know of the challenge and requesting an updated address. I have looked each of them up and have found the following:

 – She has previously lived and voted in Franklin and Hart Counties, both of which are in Georgia. Placed in Challenged Status as of 06-11-2022 and will remain in challenged status until we get an updated address from her or until she registers to vote in another county, and we are notified of the change.

I am writing to follow up with you in regards to the 3 questionable voters sent your way last month who appear to be registered at and who seem to have voted from a nonresidential business addresses as their residential address.

While you may have already removed these voters from your rolls, if you missed them then we are notifying you as these registrations could suggest an intent to hide the nature of their addresses (by marking them as a unit, suite, or apartment), or it could simply be a clerical error, or it could be something else like a grandfather clause.

To be clear, these are their listed residential addresses. Many voters we found either had no mailing address or the residential address was the same as the mailing address, which was linked to a nonresidential location - meaning transposition or clerical error would not be possible or explain the reasoning.

We request an investigation into these individuals who appear to have registered and voted from what appears to be a nonresidential location. If these are indeed fraudulent registrations, then we request the voter rolls be cleaned of their names, but ideally you consider prosecution if they intentionally deceived the county registrars and state of Georgia.

We are bringing to your attention 3 voters in Macon County who appear to be registered at and appear to have voted from nonresidential business addresses as their residential address as of the 2020 General Election.

While you may have already removed these voters from your rolls, if you missed them then we are notifying you as these registrations could suggest an intent to hide the nature of their addresses by marking them as a unit, suite, or apartment, or it could simply be a clerical error, or it could be something else like a grandfather clause.

To be clear, these are not the voters' listed mailing addresses, but their listed residential addresses. Many voters we found either had no mailing address or the residential address was the same as the mailing address, which was linked to a nonresidential location - meaning transposition or clerical error would not be possible or explain the reasoning. Is there a grandfathered clause that would have made this an exception? We don't see how this is legal in any way.

Hopefully the original voter registration records could help determine if they intentionally registered and voted from the UPS, perhaps with the assistance of the County DA. If this has gone on for years, it seems that this should be checked out because if they merely are challenged and change, then this has no real consequences.

Thank You for your concern. As you know we have had two elections going on back-to-back recently and I apologize that I am just now getting back to you on this matter. I can't speak for what was done in 2020 because I did not work for the Elections & Registration Office at that point in time, but I have done my research on both voters and their registration information.

Starting with [REDACTED] he registered in Pickens County to vote in 2014, he has voted in every election since 2018 in Pickens County. The physical address that I have listed for him is 295 North Main Street and while it looks like it is only storage units, that property is zoned and has several apartments on the premises. If [REDACTED] voted absentee because he is out of state at the time the election took place, he is allowed to do that. I have not received any notice from another state or DDS that he has moved, and I have not had any return mail from correspondence we have sent out including his recent redistricting postcard.

Next [REDACTED] she registered in Pickens County to vote in 2018, she has voted in every election since 2020 in Pickens County. The physical address that I have listed for her is 4817 Highway 53 East, Tate. My research indicates that this is zoned as a shopping center and a voter should not be registered to a commercial business as their place of residency. I have reached out to my state liaison about this matter and have been instructed to take it in front of my board.

If the board makes the decision to take them off our voter roll based on the address being invalid our office will send a letter to the voter and ask for them to come in and update with a valid address within 30 days. If they do not respond we will take them off our voter list.

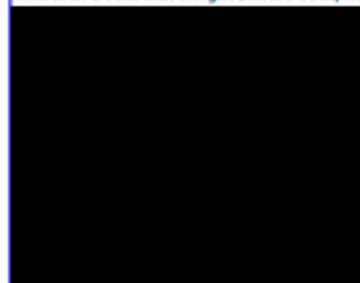

I am writing to follow up with you in regards to 5 questionable voters sent your way 3 weeks ago who appear to be registered at and who seem to have voted from a USPS and UPS Store as their residential address.

While you may have already removed these voters from your rolls, if you missed them then we are notifying you as these registrations could suggest an intent to hide the nature of their addresses (by marking them as a unit, suite, or apartment), or it could simply be a clerical error, or it could be something else like a grandfather clause.

To be clear, this is their listed residential address. Many voters we found either had no mailing address or the residential address was the same as the mailing address, which was linked to a nonresidential location - meaning transposition or clerical error would not be possible or explain the reasoning.

We request an investigation into these individuals who appear to have registered and voted from what appears to be a nonresidential location. If these are indeed fraudulent registrations, then we request the voter rolls be cleaned of their names, but ideally you consider prosecution if they intentionally deceived the county registrars and state of Georgia.

Please keep us posted on the results of the investigation into these voters, thank you!



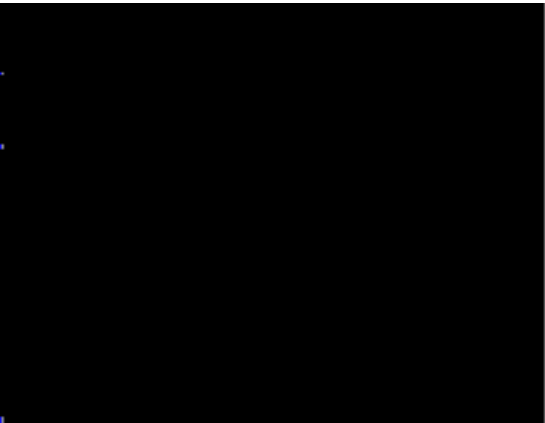

We also used third party tools, such as numbar, mylife, fastpeoplesearch, peoplefinders, etc. to locate emails and phone numbers not already presented in the voter record, as this would often yield social media account information. We also evaluated the military status of cases on the basis of proximity to a military base or the use of a military address, or if the individual had a military or similar occupational justification as determined by a LinkedIn record, etc.

If this is indeed an ineligible registration, we would like at minimum to have the voter rolls cleaned of this name, but also ideally be investigated and prosecuted if they knowingly resided in another state and still voted in Georgia past a reasonable period of time to change their address.



We are bringing to your attention a voter in your county who appears to have voted from out of state despite registering a permanent residence there according to the National Change of Address (NCOA) database.

The US Postal Service (USPS) maintains the National Change of Address database. It includes individuals who request to have their mail forwarded and provides the individual's original address, their new forwarding address, and indicates either a permanent or temporary move status. An individual submitting to the NCOA database online must submit an address-verified credit card for a token payment and as a means of authenticating residency.

We matched the entire voter registration database as obtained from the state of Georgia through a licensed vendor for matching by the USPS. (The licensed vendor does not conduct the matching process but rather the USPS does.) The NCOA database maintains records going back four years, and we did not match any records that filed move notices subsequent to October 2, 2020.

While a permanent move out of state typically serves as grounds to invalidate an individual's right to vote in Georgia, exceptions do occur, particularly for members of the US military, currently enrolled students, federal workers, caretakers, UOCAVA, etc. False positives also can occur, such as where the USPS did not correctly match an individual or where voter made a permanent move out of state but then moved back.

We analyzed NCOA matches and subjected them to further investigation by using a variety of public and semi-publicly available tools to find supplemental evidence of one's residential status to eliminate false positives. We determined if a subject had established residency outside the state, or whether they were qualified to vote in Georgia as they had not moved, had moved out but moved back, or had an exception (like military, student, federal worker, caretaker, UOCAVA, etc.) despite moving.

Tools included news articles, property records, tax records, and court records as well as social media websites Facebook, LinkedIn, Twitter, Pinterest, Instagram, and YouTube, along with blogs, review sites like Yelp and Google Reviews and others. We also used third party tools, such as numbr, mylife, fastpeoplesearch, peoplefinders, etc. to locate emails and phone numbers not already presented in the voter record, as this would often yield social media account information. We also evaluated the military status of cases on the basis of proximity to a military base or the use of a military address, or if the individual had a military or similar occupational justification as determined by a LinkedIn record, etc.

If this is indeed an ineligible registration, we would like at minimum to have the voter rolls cleaned of this name, but also ideally be investigated and prosecuted if they knowingly resided in another state and still voted in Georgia past a reasonable period of time to change their address.


We have a lot of information about the individual (all available from public sources and social media) and we are happy to submit the data for your review upon request should your investigation require it. Thank you for the call and I apologize that the county did not include the information about the questionable voter in Toombs County.

I looked closer and here's the notes:



He was registered to vote in Florida as of [REDACTED] at [REDACTED]

He was arrested out of state and on probation from October 15, 2015 to October 14, 2020:
[REDACTED]

This would explain the inactive and non-voting FL status as he could not legally vote there until his sentence was completed, and since he didn't vote for 2 general elections (2016 & 2020) then he was made inactive under FL law. This is fine, the issue is in Georgia.

He registered while still on probation in Georgia on August 28, 2020 as mentioned previously.

This is illegal according to the SOS: <https://georgia.gov/register-vote>

"Convicted felons are not eligible to register and vote in the State of Georgia except upon completion of the sentence, including any probation, parole, or payment of fines owed."

In any case, he voted absentee (early in person) on October 19, 2020, which was canceled.

Although canceled, the attempt was still illegal due to the registration date.

So both the registration and vote were ineligible and presumably illegally cast. He is still currently registered as an active voter.
